

WHO CAN JOIN

Enrolled Tulalip Tribal members and any other enrolled native in Snohomish County with suspected delays due to Intellectual and/or Developmental Disabilities (IDD). The preference list is as follows:

- Enrolled Tulalip Tribal Children birth-18 (on and off the reservation)
- Children born to enrolled Tulalip
 Tribal members who aren't enrolled
- Other native enrolled members that live in Snohomish County (Proof of tribal enrollment is required if requesting preference)

PARENT REQUESTS

Parents can request support and services through the Family Haven program by contacting the IDD Case Manager or Family Haven Manager. They can request assistance with:

- Applications for medical, financial, and tribal programs
- Connecting to ongoing resources
- Educational opportunities & trainings
- Tribal-led support groups for parents
- Playgroup activities and events
- Navigating SSI and support services



APPLICATION ASSISTANCE

Programs/Grants

- Bens Fund: Individuals with Autism can qualify for up to \$1,000 of needed items if approved.
- Provail: Apply for a communication device.
- **Tribal Disability**: Assistance with application and gathering medical records.
- Disabled Parking Placard
- DDA (Developmental Disabilities Association): Community-based services in and out of the home, providing access to support, care, and resources for individuals with a disability.
- Navigating SSI: Supplemental Security Income
