RESOLUTION 2024 - 010

Tulalip Tribal Code 3.40.150 Unlawfully Applying Graffiti

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors is the governing body of the Tulalip Tribes under the Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribes approved by the United States Commissioner of Indian Affairs and the Secretary of the Interior on January 24, 1936, pursuant to the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984, 25 U.S.C. § 5123);

WHEREAS, under the Tulalip Tribes Constitution Article VI, Sections 1 (K) & (L), the Board of Directors has the authority to safeguard and promote the peace, safety, morals, and general welfare of the Tulalip Reservation by regulating the conduct of trade and the use and disposition of property upon the reservation, and to promulgate and enforce ordinances governing the conduct of members of the Tribes providing for the maintenance of law and order and the administration of justice by establishing a tribal court and defining its duties and powers; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ENACTED, by the Board of Directors of the Tulalip Tribes: the attached ordinance is hereby adopted and shall be codified as section 3.40.150 of the Tulalip Tribal Code.

These attached changes to the Tulalip Tribal Code shall be in full force and effect upon its approval by the Superintendent of the reservation or ten (10) days following presentation to the Superintendent of the reservation pursuant to the Tulalip Constitution Art. VI, § 2.

ADOPTED by the Board of Directors of the Tulalip Tribes of Washington at a regular board meeting assembled on the 12th day of January, 2024, with a quorum present, by a vote of 4 For, 0 Against, and 0 Abstain.

TTC 3.40.150 Unlawfully applying graffiti

- 1) A person commits the offense of unlawfully applying graffiti if the person, having no right to do so, nor reasonable ground to believe that the person has such right, writes, paints, or draws any inscription, figure, words, or mark of any type on the property of another.
- 2) Unlawfully applying graffiti is a Class A offense for a first violation and a Class B offense for second or subsequent violations.
- 3) In addition to any fine imposed for unlawfully applying graffiti, the Court shall impose a penalty of 100 hours of community service. The community service must include removing graffiti, which may include graffiti the defendant applied in violation of this section. The community service must be completed within six months after entry of the order unless the person shows good cause why community service cannot be completed within the six-month time period.
