Purpose

To provide parents/guardians a process where they can request and receive assistance to ensure the safety and welfare of their child is being addressed.

Enrollment

- Tulalip Tribal families with a youth ages 13–17, up to their 18th birthday
- Custodial parent(s) or legal guardian(s) of a Tulalip Tribal member
- The youth is absent from home for at least seventy-two (72) consecutive hours without consent of their parent(s) or guardian(s)
- The youth is beyond the management of their parent(s) or guardian(s) such that the youth's behavior endangers the health, safety, or welfare of the youth or any person
- The youth has a substance abuse problem for which there are no pending criminal charges related to the substance abuse; or
- The youth has excessive unexcused absences or excessively late to school or who is not participating in their education without good reason.

Initiating Services:

- After referral form is filled out and staff assess info the Case Manager will attempt contact within three (3) business days to schedule an intake meeting (meetings may be held in person, over the phone, or video conference)
- Client will fill out intake form and ROI
- Client will be provided with an overview of the program
- A follow-up meeting will be scheduled same day or within three (3) business days.

What does the YINS Case Manager do?

- Assist in identifying issues
- Assist families with pre-filing services, filing a Youth in Need of Services Petition, and monitoring of the court case
- Regularly communicate and meet with the client in accordance to individualized case plan
- Assist the court in developing an individualized case plan tailored to the unique needs of each family
- Document how each service provided has helped client's reunification with their legal guardian

Our Mission:

YINS is a program offered through Tulalip Family Haven in collaboration with Tulalip Tribal Court. The goal is not to punish youth or their families, but rather to reconcile and work together for the family.
