



WHAT IS IDD?

Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities (IDD) begin in childhood and may affect thinking, learning, and physical development.

An intellectual disability is characterized by differences in the ability to learn, reason, and problem solve. It also impacts adaptive behavior, meaning everyday life and social skills.

Developmental disabilities are a broader category that includes intellectual and physical disabilities.

Examples of IDD Include:

- Autism
- Dyslexia
- Down Syndrome
- Visual or hearing impairments
- Unspecified learning disorders
- Sensory processing disorders

IDD may not always be obvious or easily identifiable in young children.

A professional evaluation is required to diagnose.

SUPPORT

- **Play groups:** activities for families involved in the program, play groups are held once per month
- **Events:** special events held quarterly
- Connection to other families
- Local resource coordination
- Updated lists of service providers (ABA, OT, and SLP)
- General education on IEP and 504 plans

APPLICATION ASSISTANCE

The IDD Case Manager can assist with applications and gathering required documentation for the following:

- **Tribal Disability:** Financial assistance for Tulalip Tribal members with disabilities
- **Developmental Disabilities Administration (DDA):** Services for individuals with developmental disabilities
- **Disability Parking Placard**
- **Ben's Fund:** Grant to support families cover costs for supportive services and items associated with autism
- **Telecommunication Equipment Distribution (TED):** Assistive telecommunication devices for individuals with disabilities

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Suspected or diagnosed delay due to intellectual and/or developmental disabilities
- Under the age of 18
- Enrolled Tulalip Tribal member or eligible for enrollment with the Tulalip Tribes
- Currently living in WA State (limited support outside of Snohomish County)
